

A fast-growing airports thanks to Aer Lingus and US pre-clearance facility for transatlantic services. Many US and European airlines fly in, plus some from Africa and Asia. The airport has two runways. A new parallel runway 10L/28R to the north is due to open soon (it is depicted on the map above). The cross runway, 16/34, is only used when the wind condition dictates, and at other times can be used as a taxiway.

Spotting Locations

1. Runway 10/28

Following the road away from the terminal, turn on to Old Airport Road, which follows the perimeter. You'll soon be alongside the main runway, and depending on the direction in use you can find raised spots at either end of the runway which give you an elevated position for photography. Many spotters congregate here. Photography is good, and most traffic will pass you eventually.

2. Runway 16

Following the perimeter road around will lead you past the fire station and to the threshold of Runway 16. Parking at the side of the road, you can take good photographs here. This runway is not used as much.

The road here has already been rerouted as construction begins on the new runway. Once complete, there will likely be similar views of aircraft using the new strip from around this location.

Rooms facing the airport have a view of arrivals on runways 28 and 34, and distant views of departures. You can see parts of the international pier, but no other gate areas. Too distant for photography.

Situated alongside to the runway 28 approach lights. Even-numbered rooms in 222-260 range look out on to the approach and you can take decent photographs of arrivals. It's a short walk to the Old Airport Rd spotting area, and there's a free shuttle to the terminal.

Public Transport

Express and local buses link Dublin Airport with the city and elsewhere in Ireland.

Buses #16 and #41 heading for Dublin will drop you ½ a mile from location 1 (Dardistown Cemetery).
